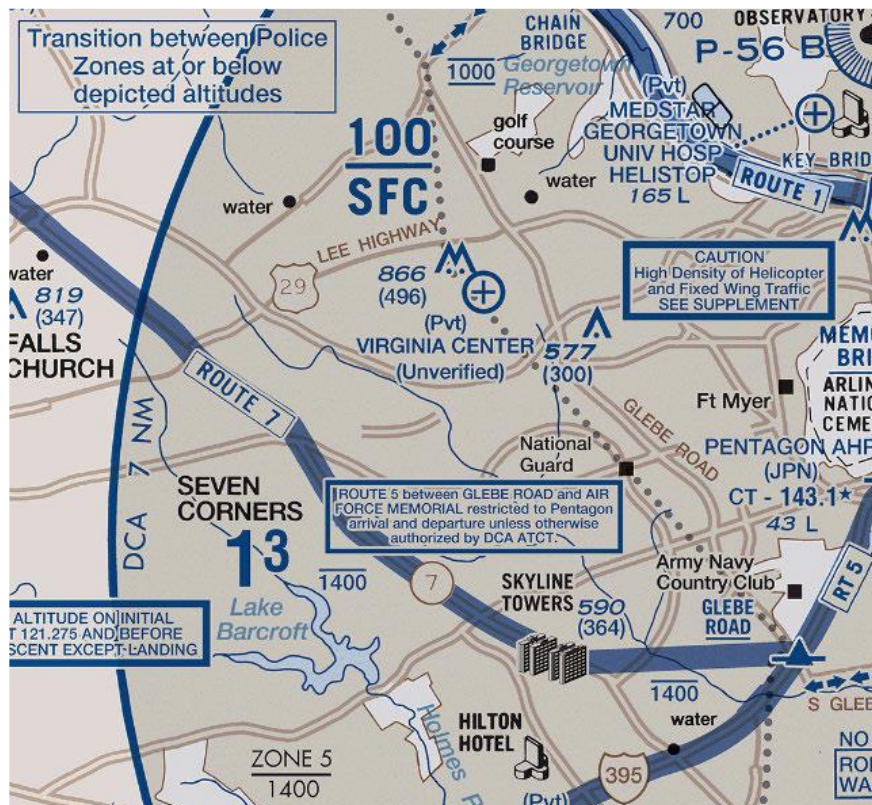

SUBJECT: Baltimore-Washington Helicopter Route Chart

DESCRIPTION

The FAA has advised Garmin that the Baltimore-Washington Helicopter Route aeronautical chart contains an erroneous annotation related to an area outside of Police Zone 5 at 38°53'26"N, 77°07'05"W, effective October 2, 2025. This erroneous annotation is reflected in the United States IFR/VFR Charts database used in all Garmin aviation products, including Garmin Pilot, for cycle 2510. The following corrected depiction will be included in the IFR/VFR Charts database in cycle 2511.

PILOT ACTION

Exercise caution when referencing the US IFR/VFR Charts database near Police Zone 5 at 38°53'26"N, 77°07'05"W.

Alerts are written for the currently effective cycle and next cycle. It is possible that data from prior cycles is also affected. Garmin recommends using the latest effective data cycle.

RESOLUTION

The corrected FAA Baltimore-Washington Helicopter chart will be included in cycle 2511 of the United States IFR/VFR Charts database. Cycle 2511 IFR/VFR Charts databases are effective October 30, 2025 and will be available October 29, 2025.

THIS ALERT SHOULD BE MADE AVAILABLE TO ALL USERS OF GARMIN AVIATION UNITS OR SYSTEMS UTILIZING AN APPLICABLE IFR/VFR CHARTS DATABASE

Garmin requests that the flight crew report any observed discrepancies related to database information. These discrepancies could come in the form of an incorrect procedure, incorrectly identified terrain, obstacles, fixes, or any other displayed item used for navigation or communication in the air or on the ground.
